

# FREE KINDERGARTEN FEES

QUALITY AREA 7 | ELAA version 1.0



## PURPOSE

This policy will provide clear guidelines for:

- free kindergarten funding for funded sessional kindergarten programs
- reduced fees for children enrolled in a funded kindergarten program in a long day care centre
- the application of surplus funding within Glass Street Kindergarten ensuring it is only used to ensure the quality of program delivery and development of children enrolled in the service
- the setting, payment and collection of (additional hours fees, or long day-care parent fees minus the Free Kindergarten Funding).



## POLICY STATEMENT

### VALUES

Glass Street Kindergarten is committed to:

- supporting the Victorian Government's Free Kindergarten initiative
- increasing access to quality kindergarten programs for all Victorian children
- ensuring there are no financial barriers for families wishing to access an early childhood program for their child/children
- maintaining confidentiality in relation to the financial circumstances of parents/guardians.

### SCOPE

This policy applies to the approved provider, persons with management or control, nominated supervisor, persons in day-to-day charge, early childhood teachers, educators, staff, parents/guardians attending Glass Street Kindergarten.

## BACKGROUND AND LEGISLATION



### BACKGROUND

The Best Start, Best Life reform will help all Victorian children dream even bigger through increased access to quality early childhood education and care. A critical part of the reform is Free Kindergarten, which will support access to two years of high-quality kindergarten programs for all Victorian children. All families with a child enrolled in a funded kindergarten program are eligible for Free Kindergarten, this includes both 3- and 4-year-old kindergarten programs.

Free Kindergarten supports families to access a funded kindergarten program by:

- providing a free 15-hour program to four-year-old children enrolled at a sessional service
- providing a free 5-to-15-hour program to three-year-old children enrolled at a sessional service (subject to the length of funded program offered)
- offsetting the funded kindergarten program component of parent fees for three- and four-year-old children enrolled at a long day care service

Free kindergarten supports every Victorian child to get the best start in life no matter where they live. Research shows that play-based learning is a powerful way to support children's learning and development. Two years of early learning is a crucial part of their educational journey, these benefits last into the school years and beyond.

Regulation 168(2) (n) of the Education and Care Services National Regulations 2011 requires that funded services have a comprehensive written fees policy, and the content of this policy must be

communicated to families. Any voluntary parent donations and/or fundraising must comply with the Free Kindergarten subsidy guidelines and be responsive to the local community.

## DEFINITIONS

The terms defined in this section relate specifically to this policy. For regularly used terms e.g. Approved provider, Nominated supervisor, Notifiable complaints, Serious incidents, Duty of care, etc. refer to the Definitions file of the PolicyWorks catalogue.

**Approved child care:** Approved child care services are services that have Australian Government approval to receive the Child Care Subsidy (*refer to Definitions*) on behalf of eligible parents. Approved child care includes centre-based day care, including long day care and occasional care, family day care, outside school hours care and in-home care. Glass Street Kindergarten is not an approved child care service.

**Child care subsidy (CCS):** A Commonwealth Government means tested subsidy to assist eligible families with the cost of child care. Payments are paid directly to approved child care providers. Families attending Glass Street Kindergarten are not eligible for the child care subsidy.

**Early Start Kindergarten:** A funding program that enables three-year-old Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children, and children known to Child Protection to attend a kindergarten program that is planned and delivered by an early childhood teacher for up to 15 hours per week. Details are available at: [www.education.vic.gov.au](http://www.education.vic.gov.au). Children that are eligible for Early Start Kindergarten (ESK) will continue to be enrolled, this ensure that service providers receive all funding entitlements and that these children have access to 15 funded hours of kindergarten across Victoria. ESK enrolments contribute to School Readiness Funding (SRF) calculations for service providers. It also allows the Department to continue to monitor efforts to engage the most vulnerable children in kindergarten across Victoria and provide additional targeted support where required through SRF or Early Childhood LOOKOUT.

**Enrolment fee:** A non-refundable fee paid to Boroondara Council when submitting an online enrolment application. Further information relating to this fee can be found on the Boroondara Council website ([www.boroondara.vic.gov.au](http://www.boroondara.vic.gov.au))

**Excursion/service event charge:** An additional charge required to meet the cost of special events or excursions that occur in response to emerging children's program needs. Events that are planned ahead and are included as an expenditure item in the service's budget do not incur this additional charge (*refer to Excursions and Service Events Policy*)

**Fees:** A charge for program hours over and above the 15 funded hours per week (600 per year)

**Free Kindergarten:** A Victorian Government initiative providing free kindergarten programs for three-year-old and four-year-old children in funded services

**Enrolment deposit:** A charge to secure a place that has been offered in a program at the service. This should not act as a barrier to enrolling for any families. Services must ensure that families understand that the enrolment deposits will only be refunded if the child commences in the service.

**Voluntary parent/guardian payment/donation:** A voluntary payment/donation for items not directly related to the provision of the children's program. Explicit and written agreement from a parent is required for any voluntary payments. Attendance at the service is not conditional on this payment.

- keep the policy up to date with current legislation and government policy, research, policy and best practice
- revise the policy and procedures as part of the service's policy review cycle, or as required
- notifying all stakeholders affected by this policy at least 14 days before making any significant changes to this policy or its procedures, unless a lesser period is necessary due to risk (*Regulation 172 (2)*).

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## ATTACHMENT 1. FREE KINDERGARTEN INFORMATION FOR FAMILIES

### Glass Street Kindergarten 2023

#### 1. General information

Kindergarten programs for four-year-old and eligible three-year-old children in Victorian Government funded services will be free as part of the Best Start, Best Life reform.

This investment will save families up to \$2,500 for each child enrolled in a participating funded kindergarten program.

DET also provides funding to assist eligible three-year-old Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander children, and children known to Child Protection, to access kindergarten programs.

#### 2. What free kindergarten means at our service

Glass Street Kindergarten has opted into the Free Kindergarten initiative. Applicable parent fees are outlined below:

- Funded sessional kindergarten for 3-year-old children (up to 15 hours per week) – no parent fee
- Funded sessional kindergarten for 4-year-old children (15 hours per week) - no parent fee
- Funded session kindergarten for 4-year-old children (19.5 hours per week) - \$2,500 per annum

Glass Street Kindergarten will reimburse families in full for any kindergarten fee deposit (*refer to Definitions*) payments that are made, excluding any voluntary parent donations/payments that you agree to in writing.

#### 3. Other charges

Other charges levied by Glass Street Kindergarten are:

- **Excursion/service event charge (outside of the 15 hours per week program):** At times throughout the year an additional excursion(s) or event(s) may be arranged where it is considered relevant to the service's program and the children's interests. At this time any additional costs to families are taken into consideration before a decision is made (*refer to Excursions and Service Events Policy*).
- **Late collection charge:** The Committee of Management reserves the right to implement a late collection charge when parents/guardians are frequently late in collecting a child from the service. This fee will be charged at a rate of \$25 for every five-minute block that the child is late being collected and will be charged at the discretion of the Committee of Management.

#### 4. 19.5-Hour Program for Four-Year-Old Kindergarten

Glass Street Kindergarten offers families a 19.5-hour program which is above the required 15 hours per week (600 hours per year). The fee for this 19.5-hour program is \$2,500 per annum.

The fee for the 19.5-hour program is determined by calculating the difference between the fees that were planned to be charged in 2023 (\$5,000) and the additional funding that Glass Street Kindergarten will receive from the government for 'Free Kinder' (\$2,500). It also takes into account the cost of incursions.

The concession fee for this program will be \$1,000 per annum.

Fees will be paid twice yearly in advance. If a family wishes to request a payment plan, please contact our bookkeeper using the contact details on the invoice.

#### 5. Fundraising and voluntary parent payment/donations

While participation in fundraising/donation is voluntary, the support of every family is encouraged. Fundraising activities are also an opportunity for families and communities to come together. Given the significant shortfall in funding that Glass Street Kindergarten will experience as a result of the 'Free Kinder' initiative, the kindergarten will be relying heavily of fundraising and donations to continue to maintain its high standard of educational programming.

#### 6. Payment of fees

Fees are payable for hours over and above 15 hours per week (600 hours per year).

The Committee of Management will regularly review payment options and procedures to ensure that they are inclusive and sensitive to families' cultural and financial situations.

Fees will be invoiced to parents/guardians via email and must be paid by the date indicated on the invoice. Each invoice will be accompanied by payment instructions. The first term's fees must be received in full prior to the child commencing at the service. For children enrolled after the commencement of a term, a pro rata invoice will be issued and must be paid in full within 14 days of the child's commencement at the service. Receipts will be provided for all fee payments, upon request.

Parents/guardians experiencing difficulty in paying fees are requested to contact the kindergarten's bookkeeper to arrange a suitable alternative payment plan. The *Privacy and Confidentiality Policy* of the service will be complied with at all times in relation to a family's financial/personal circumstances.

## 7. Unpaid fees

If fees are not paid by the due date, the following steps will be taken.

- If fees are not paid by the due date, a reminder email with a copy of the invoice will be sent by the Bookkeeper.
- If fees are still not paid and/or there is no response from the family, the Administration Officer will contact the parents/guardian and will discuss a range of support options available to the family, including the establishment of a payment plan, if required.
- If fees still remain unpaid, the agreed payment plan is not being adhered to and/or the family has not received an extension, the family will be invited to attend a meeting with the President (or Vice President) and Administration Officer to discuss the range of support options available and/or establish a payment plan (if not already done so). This should occur before the end of Term 2.
- Failure to attend the meeting and continued non-payment may result in a letter notifying the parents/guardians that the child's place at the service may be withdrawn unless payment is made in full or payments are made as per the agreed payment plan. The payment plan may need to be modified if the parents/guardians fall behind in their payments. This letter will also include information on a range of support options available for the family.
- If non-payment continues, the family will be strongly urged to meet with the President (or Vice President) and Administration Officer. This is to occur mid-Term 4 (i.e. November).
- The Committee of Management will continue to offer support and will reserve the right to employ the services of a debt collector.
- If a decision is made to withdraw the child's place at the service, the parents/guardians will be provided with 14 days' notice in writing.
- No further enrolments of children from the parents/guardians will be accepted until all outstanding fees have been paid.

## 8. Refund of fees

The enrolment deposit (*refer to Definitions*) will be fully refunded to families only when the child commences at the service.

In any other case, fees are non-refundable except if the child's place is immediately filled. Exceptional circumstances may apply – these are at the discretion of the Committee of Management. There will be no refund of these fees in the following circumstances:

- a child's short-term illness
- public holidays
- family holiday during operational times
- closure of the service for one or more days when a qualified educator is absent, and a qualified reliever is not available
- closure of the service for staff training days
- closure of the service due to extreme and unavoidable circumstances.

In addition, there will be no refund where a family chooses not to send their child to the program for the maximum number of hours for which they are enrolled.

**9. Support services**

Families experiencing financial hardship often require access to family support services. Information on these services may be available from the kindergarten service provider or alternatively families may contact the local council.

**10. Notification of fee changes during the year for extended hours/wrap around care**

Fees set for the year would only be reviewed in extraordinary circumstances, for example, if attendance rates fall below the budget 'break even' point. Parents/guardians will be notified one term in advance of any required fee increase and will be offered the option to request a payment plan.
